


## **Toastmasters Websites Quick Start Guide**


As a member of Toastmasters, you will use three websites. Keep in mind, these websites **do not** talk to each other.

## EasySpeak - toastmasterclub.org

- This is primarily for requesting speeches and meeting roles.
- You should have been emailed log in details.
- To request a speech or meeting role, click on the meeting on the right of the screen. On the next screen, under My Participation on the left, click on Request a Speech/Sign Up for Meetings as applicable. Follow the prompts to sign up. (Note, you cannot sign up for the Toastmaster role this way- if you would like to be Toastmaster, please reach out to the VP of Education).




 When requesting a speech, select the path and assignment (this relates to Pathways, see below) by selecting it from the middle tab titled Workbook and speech. For the speech title on the first tab, it is fine to put TBA if you do not know the title. If you do this, please update the title by the end of the day on the Sunday before the meeting.



## Toastmasters International - toastmasters.org

- As a new member, this is used primarily to access the online training platform, Pathways.
- When you first use the site, you will need to create a password by using the link on the log in screen.
- Once logged on, click on Go to Basecamp, this will take you to the online learning platform. You will need to choose a path from the following paths:
  - 1) Dynamic Leadership
  - 2) Engaging Humour
  - 3) Motivational Strategies
  - 4) Persuasive Influence
  - 5) Visionary Communication
  - 6) Presentation Mastery

You have the option of taking an assessment to decide the best path for you. Your first Path is complimentary; additional Paths incur a cost of around \$25.
